Currently, 41.1% of the 95,126 housing units in the area are owner occupied; 49.9%, renter occupied; and 9.0% are vacant. Currently, in the U.S., 58.5% of the housing units in the area are owner occupied; 31.7% are renter occupied; and 9.8% are vacant. In 2020, there were 92,683 housing units in the area and 8.8% vacant housing units. The annual rate of change in housing units since 2020 is 0.80%. Median home value in the area is \$173,482, compared to a median home value of \$308,943 for the U.S. In five years, median value is projected to change by 3.24% annually to \$203,448.
